NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2024

NOTE 1. STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

This financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of Members and the Northern Territory of Australia Associations Act. The Committee has determined the Association is not a reporting entity.

The accounting policies adopted by the Association are stated in order to assist in a general understanding of the financial statements. These policies have been consistently applied except as otherwise indicated.

(a) Reporting Entity

The Association is not a reporting entity because in the committee's opinion there are unlikely to exist users who are unable to command the preparation of reports tailored so as to satisfy all of their information needs, and these accounts are therefore "special purpose accounts" that have been prepared solely to meet the requirements of the Constitution and the Associations Act.

(b) Accounting Policies

The financial report has been prepared under the historical cost conventions and does not take into account changing money values, or, except where stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

In order for the financial report to present fairly the state of affairs of the Association and the results of the Association for the year, Australian Accounting Standards have been adopted to the extent disclosed in the notes.

© Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks, and other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less.

(d) Revenue Recognition

Revenue is recognised to the extent that it is probable that the economic benefits will flow to the Association and the revenue can be reliably measured.

Grant and donation Income is recognised when the association obtain control of the funds which is generally at the time of receipt. Grant Income is treated as Income when the association is not required to refund any unexpended amount.

(e) Income Tax

The members are of the understanding that the Association is exempt from income tax.

(f) Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Tax Office. The association is registered for GST.

(g) Events after the Balance Sheet Date

No matter or circumstance has arisen since 30 June 2024 that has significantly affected, or may significantly affect the Association's operations, the results of those operations, or the Association's state of affairs in future financial years.

NOTE 2 Other

The balance of Other asset \$3,818 relates to an attempt by the Treasurer to make a payment to the Australian Taxation Office of GST. Unfortunatly an error in processing resulted in the payment being credited at the ATO to another Not For Profit taxpayer. Subsequent to year end this amount has been reimbursed by the Treasurer.
